Her flapping, hands over the ears, noises when she is upset, and sensory overload have almost completely gone away. I remember how she was when we were at training. She was flapping, covering her ears, making noises and unable to handle it.

You would not believe that she is the same child today! Ask anyone, and they'll tell you she's a normal nine-year-old little girl. Brock has become her best friend, her protector, and her confidant. She will tell him anything!
